Social Security Scam

The email appears to be from the SSA, complete with logos, and states you have a statement available. Unsurprisingly, this is a fraudulent email. Downloading the attachment installs software that lets cybercriminals access your computer. This software allows them to take full control of your device and steal your personal information, banking details, and private files. They can then use this information to steal your identity and commit financial fraud!

- Never download attachments from unexpected emails or texts. Remember that real government agencies typically communicate sensitive information through US Mail-not email and definitely not text.
- Check the sender's email address carefully. Scammers often use sender addresses that look similar to official ones but have small differences.
- Always stop and think before you click!
